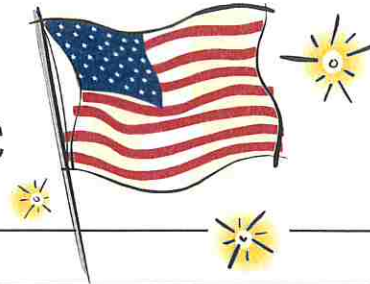

Message from Mayor Dennis Dunn...

Get ready because here it comes. Elk Ridge Drive (1600 West) from Salem Canal Road to 11200th South will be closed for at least a month starting the second week in July and running until the second week in August. As the sewer line turns east on 11200th South, that road will be partially closed as the new sewer line is installed in the South shoulder of the road, and it will run East to Woodland Hills stopping just short of the roundabout. We will be hooked on to the new sewer line close to the late September date that has been anticipated.

Also be aware that Elk Ridge has had an increase in vandalism this year. The sheriff has expressed concerns about this increase and has asked that we all pay a little more attention to what is going on around us. If any suspicious activities such as tagging, mail boxes being destroyed, or theft of personal property takes place, please report those activities to the sheriff. It would be prudent to keep your doors locked and garage doors shut. The curfew law will be enforced in order to try to stay ahead of the wave. Our curfew here is 11 PM to 5 AM all days for 16 and younger and from 11 PM to 5 AM Sunday - Thursday & 1 AM to 5 AM Friday & Saturday for minors under the age of 18. Parents or legal guardians are responsible for the acts of the minor children in their care.

The new development to the North end of town is a PUD (Planned Unit Development) and the park that is being put in is owned and cared for by the home owners in the Elk Ridge Meadows development. It is not a city or public park and should be respected as private property. Any unauthorized use of that park may result in action taken by that home owners association. Please read and pay attention to the posted signs at the park.
