WATER DEVELOPMENT LOAN APPLICATION

DEVELOPMENT FEES FOR CANYON LOTS

Safe Drinking Water Loan Application, and C.D.B.G. applications will also be considered.

Preliminary plat approval was given on five lots for Hal Shuler in Loafer Canyon SHULER LOAFER in 1981. At that time credit for development fees was recognized for those five lots. Recently this credit for development fees was transferred to the Goosenest Plat A Subdivision. Hal Shuler questioned that the preliminary plat for the five lots in Loafer Canyon included a lot which is now owned by the L.D.S. Church. He claims that there was another preliminary plat which included a different lot. Currently there is nothing in the records to substantiate Mr. Shuler's claim. Shuler stated that the lots given Mr. preliminary plat approval in 1981 are not considered lots at this time.

TEST WELL Councilman Shuler reported for the driller, Mark Doxey, that perforating the pipe prior to driving it down weakens the pipe. Whereas perforating after the pipe is in place allows the driller to be more exact in placing the perforations where they should be, since they have no way of knowing how far down they will be able to drive the pipe. Councilman Shuler reminded the council that the further down the driller can go with the larger pipe the larger the volume of water.

> Council reviewed the change order from Doxey Drilling and discussed the cost for explosive charges vs perforating with mills knife and concluded that depending on the depth the 12" casing goes down the costs could differ greatly. The mills knife could take longer, which based on an hourly rate would be more costly.

TEST WELL Council discussed loan rates based on information received from the Utah League of Cities & Towns Municipal Cooperative for \$30,000 & \$50,000 loan. Homer Chandler advised inquiring into a loan from Safe Drinking Water and Farmers' Home Administration.

> Council discussed other costs to finish well would include \$3000 for a 10 HP motor. Council discussed the need to have a complete finished bid with high and low projected costs for the total project.

> The change order also included additional mobilization charges of \$200, to cover hand moving the extra pipe to get behind well site. the Also, \$5.00 per ft. additional for drilling 12" instead of 8" from 108' to 400'. The cost for the 12" in now \$16.75 and increase casing of \$1.75 per ft. from the original bid. Council calculated the total cost of the change order could be \$6000.

> MOTION WAS MADE BY HAL SHULER, TO CHANGE ORDER FOR 12" CASING AUTHORIZE THE TO A DEPTH NOT TO EXCEED 400'. Councilman Prather asked for discussion on the motion. He stated that he voted against this well in the beginning and requested his reasons for abstaining be included in the minutes as follows:

> First, the geologist report was ignored by council, the reason being given that it would cost too much for pipeline to bring the line from where the geologist recommended to the system. By ignoring the geologist the report council jeopardized the application for a loan from the Bureau of Clean Water, because they require a geologist's report and we don't have a geologist's report on this well site. All we have is Hal Shuler's recommendation based on а dowser's findings. We depleted our financial reserves and it was agreed with everyone on the council, except Hal Shuler inorder to get into this thing.

All you can base your actions on now is hope that this thing will pan and there's been not that much hope out extended by the driller because he started out almost assuring us he would get 80 to 100 gpm and now he's down to 20-30 gpm, maybe, and not knowing that. So we did all this flying by the seat of our pants. I say we, as I pointed out, I was the one who voted against I'm going to it. abstain from this vote and I think that due to Councilman Shuler's conflict of interest in this kind of thing that he should abstain, and that will be my I won't have anything to do position. with putting more of the Town's money into an operation like this. You're in it so deep now that its like being at the slots and running out of cash to buy a bus ticket home, you gotta keep trying and that's where I think we find ourselves thanks to Councilman Shuler's efforts.

The undersigned, James R. Winterton, President, for Salem Hills Home Owners Assoc., and their attorney of record have offered to accept the following:

SETTLEMENT

In full final and complete settlement of all rights, claims or causes of action of an kind which the plaintiffs have or may claim to have growing out of or arising from said claimed obligation; and denying all liability, in order to avoid the time and expense necessary in litigation, have agreed to such settlement purely and simply as a compromise of the disputed claim and without admitting liability for said incident.

NOW THEREFORE, Elk Ridge Town, a Utah Municipal Corporation and James R. Winterton, personally and as President of Salem Hills Home Owners Association, joined herein by their attorneys of record, for and in consideration of settlement indicated herein and in behalf of the town of Elk Ridge, defendants, and Salem Hills Home Owners Association, a Utah Corporation, plaintiffs, and David J. Winterton, attornev for plaintiffs, hereby agree to the following settlement:

1. Twenty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$27,000), as represented by Letter of Credit attached hereto. This Letter of Credit shall be used only towards the Sewer System Facility Improvement Construction Fees, only of Elk Ridge Town.

Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, is expressly it agreed and understood, for the considerations, named, the undersigned, James R. Winterton for Salem Hills Home Owners Assoc., joined by their attorneys, do by these presents release, relinguish and discharge unto defendants, the of Elk Ridge, town their legal representatives, successors, and assigns, and any other persons, firms or corporations legally responsible, of and from any and all claims of whatever kind or character arising from the incident in question, regardless of whether or not said claims are now known or asserted in plaintiffs pleadings or otherwise.

Provided, however, it is expressly agreed and understood that the settlement made herein is in compromise and settlement of the claims of the plaintiffs and the same is not intended and shall not be taken to be an admission of liability on the part of the defendants, or any person, firm or corporation, legally responsible for the incident, and that this settlement is made purely and simply as a compromise settlement of a disputed claim in order to avoid the further costs of litigation.

In order to induce the defendants to make this compromise settlement, the plaintiffs hereby represent that no one connected with the defendants has made any representations of an kind to them either as to liability or as to the extent of damages and the plaintiffs hereby state that they are in full agreement with the making of this compromise settlement and executing this release and they have consulted their own legal counsel.

It is further agreed and understood that the suit which has been heretofore filed shall be dismissed with prejudice.

The town clerk further reported that jurisdictions which have an assessed value comprised primarily of residential development have to rely upon the residents to pay for all services, repay all debt, and fund the maintenance and replacement of infrastructure.

In a primarily residential jurisdiction, such as Elk Ridge, there will ultimately have to be significant tax increases required or major reductions in maintenance, service and infrastructure quality.

A local government which has a well balanced "growth mix" will have a good portion of its land dedicated to non-residential development. Non-residential development typically requires less in services and pays more in revenues than residential development, thus off setting the costs of services provided to residential development.

The council needs to identify for what purpose the fund balances should be designated. Saving, "just to save" is not beneficial to the community. Recommendation was made to maintain 15% of the budget in a fund balance to meet operating needs until property taxes are received each year. Anything above the 15%, should be designated to a specific capitol project. Minutes of the Elk Ridge Town Council Work Session - 5-8-90

Further recommendation was made to not allow accounts to become more than 60 days in arrears. Allowing accounts to become more than 60 days in arrears means allowing others to operate on municipal funds.

1989/1990 BUDGET AMENDMENTS Council reviewed Resolution No. 90-6-29-1 which outlined the proposed budget amendments, recognizing that there is no increase in the general fund budget. However, it is estimated that the total revenue will exceed what was budgeted.

The general fund expenditures budget amendments include an increase in administration, reduction in elections, reduction in police department, increase in fire department, increase in highway & streets construction with a decrease in highway & streets repair and maintenance. Sanitation is being reduced, health & welfare is being increased, with parks being reduced. Fixed assets was increased and a budgeted increase in the fund balance has been budgeted to balance the expenditures with the revenues.

The capital projects fund for the park pavilion was amended to show an available beginning balance and a transfer of that balance to the fire station bldg/town hall capital projects fund to close the pavilion account.

1989/1990The capital projects fund for the fire stationBUDGETbldg/town hall was amended to correct theAMENDMENTSbeginning balance and show the transfer from(CONTINUED)the park pavilion.

The enterprise fund for the water department was changed to reflect the non-operating revenue received from the development and connection fees. Also, to meet cash flow needs until the water revenue bond is completed, a loan of \$43,000 will be made from the sewer fund. This will be repaid when the water revenue bond monies are received.

The enterprise fund for the sewer department was changed to show the increase in operating revenue with no change in operating expenses. Non-operating revenues were changed to show actual revenue received to date. The loan of \$43,000 to the water fund was also included as an amendment.
