JOHN W. Based on the information provided by the town THOMAS clerk, the Council decided that a bronze plague PAVILION measuring 5"X18" at a cost of approximately \$100 would be preferable. City of Spanish Fork had the plaques for their memorial square made by the Eagle Foundry and are silica bronze. McGees Trophies has a bronze plaque which costs approximately \$100. Clerk will check with the Foundry to determine what the costs for a plaque will be from them. It will take six weeks for the plaque to be done from either place, which will delay the dedication ceremony.

PROPOSAL TO Mr. & Mrs. Judson want to build a home on lot TO AMEND SALEM 9, Plat I. Their contractor inquired with the HILLS SUBDIV. town clerk as to the lot being a corner lot PLAT I - because of a piece of property located between DONOVAN JUDSON lot 9 and lot 10. There was a question as to whether the property is a street.

#### Minutes of the Elk Ridge Town Work Session - 10-8-91

Mayor Bean and the town clerk reviewed the plat and concluded that because it does not meet the minimum width requirement it cannot be a street. Therefore the lot cannot be a corner lot. The property in question was drawn on the plat so the L.D.S. church property to the east would have access to the church parking lot from Escalante Drive using the property as an alley or driveway.

The county recorders office has stated that the manner in which it is drawn on the plat indicates it is a extension of Escalante Drive, and Elk Ridge Town is the owner. The Judsons are interested in buying the property. In order to accomplish this, Plat I would need to be vacated and then if sold conveyed to the buyer with a deed. On behalf of the L.D.S. Church, John Peterson has indicated to the town clerk that the L.D.S. church would have no claim on the property and would not oppose the Judsons purchasing the property.

Councilman Foster indicated any monies received from the sale of that property should be designated to the roads budget.

The possibility of charging greenbelt prices was mentioned.

Question as to the selling price for the property and requiring an appraisal to determine a value was discussed. Questions related to the selling price for the property caused concern for the Judsons should the value be that of a building lot. Mr. Judson questioned having to pay for an appraisal. James Prather indicated the need to keep the town's fiduciary records proper dictates there should be some kind of an official declaration of the value of the property so that there is no question about how a determination was made. Appraisal needs to be completed prior to public hearing notices being sent and scheduling for Planning Commission Meeting.

This will be an increase of \$1.25 per residence per month for each container. Mr. Betts indicated the rate for the automated containers is negotiable. Discussion included the use of a large roll off for quarterly clean up, which Mr. Betts indicated could be provided by Laidlaw with Elk Ridge paying for landfill costs only. Recycling was also discussed. Mr. Betts indicated there is only 6 market for recycling cardboard in Utah County at this time. A container could be located within the town for this purpose. A chipper/shredder was discussed, but would need monitoring by an employee of the town. MOTION WAS MADE BY JAMES PRATHER, SECONDED BY HAL SHULER, TO ACCEPT THE IDEA OF AUTOMATED GARBAGE CONTAINERS AND A LARGE ROLL OFF CONTAINER FOR QUARTERLY CLEAN UP WITH A CONTRACT TO BE NEGOTIATED WITH LAIDLAW WASTE SYSTEMS. VOTE: YES-ALL(4); NO-NONE(0); ABSENT-DENNIS SHIRLEY(1). Containers are to be delivered by Laidlaw in December, and billing to begin in January. Mr. Betts indicated he will draft a new agreement to present to the council. Residents are to be notified by letter.

EXCEPTION TO WATER RIGHTS RIRIE

Ron Ririe informed the council he was granted three water rights with his Plat A three lot TO BE CONVEYED subdivision. He intends to develop property on TO TOWN - RON the east side of the L.D.S. church into three lots and another plat with 2 lots adjacent to the Plat A subdivision. He requested the council grant him the exception to the water rights being conveyed to the Town and allow him to pay the \$500 per lot. Mayor Bean explained the present situation being there is no reserve water rights available at this time. Although, there is sufficient water rights for the number of approved platted lots. The town is presently filing an application to acquire additional rights, but the process has not been completed.

Mr. Ririe questioned if the council would then allow him to use the three water rights from the three lots on the previously approved Ririe Subdivision, Plat A at will among the eight lots, which include Plat A, and future Plat B and Plat C. Concern was expressed as to how this could be controlled and the complications which could arise.

Tony Searle stated the amount of water the town has should be used for existing residents needs, not new development, at least until additional water sources are developed.

Those present briefly discussed development surrounding the golf course in Elk Ridge and Payson areas. Engineer Bruce Hall indicated it is not in the best interests of Elk Ridge to provide water to areas outside of Elk Ridge.

SCHEDULE FOR SPECIAL IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

Engineer Bruce Hall reported to the council problems the inclement weather has created. The soil needs to be drier for the asphalt work to be completed. H. E. Davis has indicated IMPROVEMENTS & that the asphalt work on Cortez, and the VARIOUS OTHER overlay repairs would be better if completed in STREET REPAIRS the Spring. The culvert work on Hillside Dr./Lakeview Drive and water & sewer lateral cuts could be filled. To facilitate the Bushman family in accessing their driveway, Cortez Drive could be graveled if the asphalt cannot be laid until Spring.

> Mr. Hall further reported that the developers with subdivision improvements scheduled for completion have indicated that unless the weather causes delays, the improvements will be completed as soon as possible.

> The council agreed with the engineer that the asphalt work would be better if completed in the spring, but the cuts for water & sewer laterals and the culvert realignment needs to be dealt with as soon as possible.

UNSCHEDULED AGENDA ITEM LETTER OF PROPOSAL TO LOAFER

APPLICATION

Engineer reviewed with the council changes Steven Killpack made to the letter of proposal being sent to Loafer Recreation Association. They included sending the letter to Donald Cole and Jerry Fuller as officers and authorized agents for the Loafer Recreation Association. Councilman Prather questioned the site for locating the proposed well as not being what the geologist recommended in his original letter. Bruce Hall explained the location of the site is a site that Bryce Montgomery has stated would be equally suited because of the close proximity to the Loafer Recreation Association well which has records of being a good source. Council asked Bruce Hall to obtain from the geologist, Bryce Montgomery a letter to that effect. Letter to Loafer is to be sent after Bryce Montgomery confirms the site of the well with a letter.

UTAH DRINKING Council reviewed the application and cover WATER BOARD letter and following a lengthy discussion asked FINANCIAL that the following changes be made: ASSISTANCE

> Engineer is to provide 1) supporting documentation as to how he determined the figures for the cost breakdown of the proposed project. Engineer indicated he can do this, but it will take him substantially more time to complete and normally he does not provide this kind of detail for the engineer's estimates being asked for on the application, and that any figures he does provide will be still be only an estimate. Mr. Hall indicated the council is not restricted to having him as the engineer for the project, but can if inclined entertain bids from other engineering firms.

3) Reduction in operating expenses(\$11,000) is expected to be in pumping costs and maintenance.

4) The size of the water line needs to be changed to 8" instead of 6", which will increase the costs of the water line from \$85,000 to \$104,000. Total project costs increase to \$329,000.

5) In Item #6, change the word "additional"to "necessary".

6) Engineer explained the reason no estimate was included for Capital Facilities, Land, etc., being that it is anticipated that negotiations with Loafer will be successful and no funding would be necessary. If not successful, negotiations are then condemnation proceedings would be financed with what was originally allocated for the reservoir(\$50,000). Attorney's estimate of costs if involving condemnation was reported as being \$50,000.

8) Engineer explained that there would be no cost for power facilities if the lines were above ground. If required to place power lines underground there will be costs.

9) All cost estimates are to be substantiated with written documentation from the engineer indicating how he determined the estimates.

Kim Peterson will provide the attached addendum referred to in item #14 which will explain that although the bond is not due to mature until January 1993, the total amount to pay off the outstanding amount on the bond is now available in a restricted account. Therefore, the annual payment does not impact the operating revenues.

If grant funds (CDBG) are obtained, the amount of the loan can be reduced by the amount of the grant.

Councilman Prather reiterated his position that the town is paying alot of money for a long time because the council failed to get supporting documentation on things previously. Councilman Prather reminded those present of the problems involved with the last water development project and does not want to see a repetition of what happened in the past.

Council was reminded that Kim Peterson had indicated to the council at the last meeting that if required to finance 125% of the bond, it could mean an increase in user rates.
Changes to cover letter include as follows:

Engineer is to rewrite paragraph 2, to clarify which of the wells being referred to are currently in use and those not connected to the system and the pumping capacity for each. Well capacity for the larger well(#5) was changed to 235 gpm, which is what the well has pumped. Paragraph 3 should read as follows: The proposed new well site was chosen after a detailed study and map location provided by a geologist retained by the town for that purpose.
