#### 3. PROPOSED CODE AMENDMENT ANIMAL CODE 10-18-6

Mayor Ellis stated that it's possible to deal with the Ram's property through a variance since they do have a unique issue with their property that isn't common with the rest of the neighborhood. The removal of the 75 foot rule will be impactful. Discussion ensued on the placement of structures and difficulty of nuisance code. Tricia Thomas stated she does not think the city should throw out the 75-foot requirement and does not think the city should change the code for 1 person. There are areas that butt up against the livestock zones. Mayor Ellis stated that even if this amendment is passed the Rams will still need a variance for landscaping. Is there no concern between the R&L and R-1 Residential? Brian Squires stated that dealing with nuisance code is not cut and dry. The area around Christly in the old Cloward estate in the middle of town being next to R-1 zone is problematic when dealing with complaints from noise, flies, smell etc. Mayor Ellis stated that it is important to not take away property rights of landowners with animal rights. Tricia Thomas stated this is a community and there has to be some rules.
