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39	1. AUDIT PRESENTATION GREG OGDEN, CPA	
40	Greg Ogden, CPA presented the results of the 20/21 audit. There were no findings or issues of	
41	noncompliance. The city is in good financial shape. He is impressed that the city is able to not have	
42	debt; the city is paying for things as you go instead of bonding in advance and paying them off for 30	
43	years. The city staff does a great and thorough job in their accounting. Mayor Ellis asked how the	;
44	non-operating revenues, 2-4% income range, is calculated and how does the city make sure that it's	
45	not over generating or under generating. Greg Ogden stated the operating income or loss tells the city	
46	if it is generating enough revenue in fees to cover the cost of running a department as well as cash	
47	reserves for covering repairs and emergencies. <u>Mayor Ellis</u> asked where the audit goes from after	
48	Greg's audit. Greg Ogden stated that Curtis Roberts will submit audit to the state auditor office where	
49	it will be placed on the state website. Generally, the state won't contact the city unless the same	
50	finding comes up 3 years in a row. If those findings are not taken care of then the state starts holding	5
51	sales tax, property tax etc. until the problem is fixed.
