29	Maureen Bushman stated Planning Commission recommended approval of Hanson Lot 70A Subdivision.					
30	The General Plan is still being updated. The transportation and trails map are almost completed. The parks					
31	map, and zoning map are being updated. Photos are being added to the zoning map. The Planning					
32	Commission is waiting on the Capital Facilities Plan to be updated in order to use the updated

34 35	PUBLIC FORUM					
36	Randy Righettini - stated this has been a beautiful community, residents took pride in their yard. He lives					
37	across the street on the corner of Escalante and Park Dr. He has sent in complaints about the trash across					
38	the street from him. This is getting out of hand and the code enforcement officer needs to step up and take					
39	care of the problem. The house across from that on the other corner is working on cars on the weekend,					
40	bringing cars home and parking them in the fire department parking lot. Thank you very much for the time					
41 42	and please address the problem. Diana Schultz - stated a sign needs to be put up directing RVs to the golf course camping ground. They are					
42 43	turning left onto the Olympic Lane.

45	1. <u>FLEET LEASE RENEWAL DISCUSSION</u>					
46	Mayor Haddock stated there have been fewer and fewer incentives given for leasing. A multi-year lease is					
47	being looked at to extend the leases on the trucks the city has now to the end of the warranty period. Mike					
48	Scott, CEO Unifed Fleet Services stated the values are holding but the incentives of 25% off is now down					
49	to \$1000. <u>Mayor Haddock</u> stated since it is a multiyear agreement the city council has to approve it.					
50 51	<u>Councilmember Thompson</u> asked would it be more beneficial to buy the trucks since the values are holding and they aren't being driven that much? How much would a used 2022 Chevy Silverado with 15,000 miles					
51 52	cost? <u>Councilmember Thomas</u> stated but then the city has to pay for the upkeep, leasing paid for part of					
53	maintenance. <u>Mayor Haddock</u> stated the trucks need to remain in warranty in case of mechanical problems.					
54	<u>Councilmember Abbott</u> stated that shouldn't be hard. <u>Councilmember Thompson</u> stated the cost of buying					
55	trucks should be considered and the figures compared with leasing if trucks could be sold and still get 90%					

of the city's money back if values are holding. <u>Mayor Haddock</u> stated the lease is a capital lease and is set up that the city would get the money if its value were more than the city owes at the end of the lease if a truck is sold. <u>Mike Scott</u> stated the city can exit the lease at any time. Currently the city is not gaining any equity with the current operating agreement. It is in the best interest of the city to consider a multiyear capital lease. <u>Councilmember Willis</u> would like to see the numbers to be able to make an informed decision and the best deal for the city. <u>Councilmember Abbott</u> stated a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> ton can have good incentives but anything larger than that forget it, there are no incentives. Interest rates are 8, 9, 10%. Things change and the council has to make the best decision possible given the events of that time. <u>Mayor Haddock</u> stated he will get the numbers to the council.

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## 2. <u>FIRECHIEF COMPREHENSIVE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN</u>

Fire Chief Waite stated it is now required by the state that every city have a comprehensive emergency management plan. He and county personnel have been working on this comprehensive plan since January. This is a living document meant to be fluid and change when needed and updated every 1-2 years. The plan is filed with the city and notification is sent to the state and county that it is in place. The county already has a copy. The county received a grant and some funding through the legislature to build a team and has been going to cities in the county. Elk Ridge is one of a few cities that is almost done with the comprehensive plan. Fire Chief Waite stated they took the best of the other cities' plans and incorporated them into the city's plan. Fire Chief Waite would like the council to let him know if there were anything they would like to add. Councilmember Willis stated that even though it is long it is very readable. Councilmember Thomas asked if there needs to be an emergency manager. Fire Chief Waite stated he is currently kind of the manager but if the city council would like to appoint a manager they absolutely could. Councilmember Thomas asked if CERT was still in use. Fire Chief Waite stated the CERT program went in the toilet a couple years ago. The program that has been being developed and in use the last couple years is Be Ready Utah which is a little different and is not as involved as CERT. Councilmember Thomas asked if there was someone over that program. Fire Chief Waite stated he can have binders made up and the city can certainly set something up. Councilmember Willis stated someone gave her items that had been stored in a barn and wondered if there were other items stored somewhere that they were not aware of. Fire Chief Waite stated if there is then most of it can be disposed of if it is perishable. Councilmember Thomas asked if during an evacuation should Elk Ridge Dr. be 2 lanes exiting the city? Fire Chief Waite stated there are a few annexes to the plan on specific emergency procedures and exiting the city is one of them which is being worked on. Another annex that is needed is a financial annex showing how the plan would be financed. There are actually 20 or so annexes available that could be used if needed, they are not all required. Councilmember Thomas asked about security and locking down the city. Fire Chief Waite said that is definitely an annex that is needed. Councilmember Abbott asked if the plan is plugged into the NIM's system. Fire Chief Waited stated it is not but it was developed based on the NIM's system. Fire Chief Waite stated his next meeting with the county is in October and will get the annexes completed.

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## 3. SURPLUS 1992 FORD RESCUE TRUCK

<u>Fire Chief Waite</u> stated the 1992 Ford Rescue truck was stripped of all usable equipment and used in the new truck. The truck is not being used, it is not insured and is taking up valuable space.
