42	hours a week. He has concerns about the city financial director and the city treasure and the					
43	closeness of those positions. He has been an auditor in several places, and at one point he was an					
44	auditor for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Some of the things you look for are					

the following of procedures and improprieties and urges the council to consider that carefully. It

might be a conflict of interest. If the city's lawyer is ok with it, then he is fine with it. He just

wants the city to be aware.

1. TASKER SUBDIVISION ENTER DURABILITY AND ACCEPT INTO THE CITY 51 Mayor Haddock stated Jerry Clark the Public Works Director has inspected it and has approved 52 53 the infrastructure and has recommended the subdivision go into the one-year durability period. This is a 2-lot subdivision on Fremont Way. Councilmember Abbott stated the letter states 54 money was paid in lieu of for curb and gutter, there is already curb and gutter. The Deputy 55 Recorder stated this is an error in the letter. 73 **3.** APPOINT CITY TREASURER DECISION

74 Mayor Haddock stated Curtis Roberts has offered to act as the city treasurer. He has proposed that he would review and sign the semiannual reports required by the Utah State Treasurer, work 75 with the city to ensure rates charged for development reflect actual cost of services, on a monthly 76 bases review disbursements, financial reports, oversee that the city is in compliance with state 77 requirements related to deposits, investments, cash management, and work with the city to 78 79 develop an investment policy and compliance with state law and monitor compliance with the policy. The city would retain the responsibility for ensuring deposits are made in accordance with 80 the state 3 day rule, retain the responsibility to have an employee as the point of contact for all 81 82 city bank accounts and investment accounts, prepare the semiannual reports required by the Utah State Treasurer, have at least 2 check signers, preferably not Royce, who review each 83 disbursement to ensure compliance with City policies and procedures, ensure that there is 84 adequate cash in the bank for disbursements reconcile all bank accounts and investment accounts. 85 With the stated concerns of Jim Chase, the city can ask the city attorney his opinion on the 86 proposal. Councilmember Abbott stated with what he is going to charge, the city can hire 87 someone to do these functions. Mayor Haddock stated Curtis Roberts has not adjusted his rates 88 since 2007 and has increased his rates by \$6000 regardless of whether he is the treasurer. 89 Councilmember Thomas recommended hiring someone to do the position. Councilmember 90 Thompson agreed. Councilmember Willis is concerned with keeping the separation of duties. 91 Discussion ensued on hiring an accounting firm or an outside source, maybe a part time person. 92 Councilmember Thompson stated it is the city's fiscal responsibility to get bids for the city 93 financial director in order to make sure the city is in the right ballpark monetarily with the 94 position. Jim Chase stated he has known Curtis for 25 years and he is a good man, very 95 reputable. Councilmember Peterson stated if Curtis is the treasurer, and he makes a mistake who 96 is going to catch that. Mayor Haddock tabled the discussion for now. 97
