2. <u>RESOLUTION 23-10-24-2R SESD BOARD APPOINTMENT</u>

Mayor Haddock stated Councilember Thompson has expressed interest in representing Elk 55 Ridge on the SESD board next year. Councilmember Abbott stated under Utah State Code 17b-56 1-304 is what SESD is managed under at least until the Utah Supreme Court decides otherwise. 57 It states that the representative doesn't have to be elected, and they just have to be a resident. If 58 Councilmember Abbott is not the representative, he would suggest Charles Wixom since Charles 59 has a degree in electrical engineering and would understand the technical side of things. 60 Councilmember Thompson stated if the council thinks that would be a better choice, then he 61 would support that. Councilmember Abbott stated he spends more time dealing with SESD on a 62 monthly basis by about 4 hours a week. He is not asking that he continue but he's not saying he 63 wouldn't. He believes in lifting where you stand and would continue to serve the community 64 and will do what he can if asked but if not, that is fine too. Councilmember Thompson stated he 65 is interested in representing the city and is very interested in what is happening with SESD on 66 behalf of the city. Councilmember Thomas asked how long the position lasts. Councilmember 67 Abbott stated the council decides how long the term is and SESD also has the right to remove 68 someone from the board. Councilmember Peterson asked how the number of board members is 69 determined. Councilmember Abbott stated the state code 17b-1-304 is being contested in the 70 courts right now and it may be determined that representation will be based on customers which 71 would give Elk Ridge City 2 board seats. Councilmember Willis stated she doesn't like the hate 72 that comes from representing the city on the board and maybe having residents represent the city 73 would be better. Councilmember Thomas stated but what is the council there to do if not to 74 represent the city? Councilmember Thomas stated she would prefer two representatives, one 75 resident and one councilmember. 76

90 Mayor Haddock thanked Councilmember Abbott for all the years and time he has spent 91 representing the city. He has done a great job and appreciates all he has done. 92 93

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3. RESOLUTION 23-10-24-1R CANCEL ELECTION, NO CONTESTED SEATS

Mayor Haddock stated that the city has 3 council seats open for election and there are 3 residents 94 who are running unopposed. By state code if a seat is uncontested the city can opt to not have an 95 election and the seat is automatically appointed. This has been confirmed by the county and the 96 97 state. All the deadlines have passed to enter a race. The write in deadline has passed, any writeins at this point do not count. Even if a candidate gets 1 vote they are in. The city will save 98 \$5,000 to \$6000 by canceling the election. Does the council want to cancel the election? 99 Councilmember Willis stated even though it doesn't change the outcome there is something about 100 protecting the process. Councilmember Thompson stated this is difficult one he sees the value in 101 respecting that we are a democratic institution and should allow people to vote but struggles with 102 wasting \$5000-\$7000 when there can be no change in the outcome and why would he spend 103 \$7000 grand to get the same result that he gets with spending \$0. Councilmember Peterson asked 104 for confirmation that the ballots were already printed. Mayor Haddock stated they were, but they 105 would just not be mailed out. Councilmember Abbott stated there isn't anything else on the ballot 106 other than the city council seats. Councilmember Thomas stated she sees both sides. 107 Councilmember Abbott stated he heard from many residents that they didn't even know there was 108 an election. Councilmember Willis stated she had posted it on social media over and over. 109 Councilmember Thomas stated it would literally be throwing money away but still. 110 Councilmember Abbott stated Woodland Hills, until this last election, has never had an election 111 because they have not had any contested seats. Council asked the two residents in attendance one 112 resident was for canceling it and the other resident said yes but....They both saw both sides. 113 Mayor Haddock asked has there been any campaigning, any signs, or websites for those running? 114 Councilmember Thomas said no why would you? Councilmember Willis said why would they 115 incur the cost? Mayor Haddock stated Bingo. RESOLUTION 23-10-24 3R PAYSON, REUSE AGREEMENT 132 Mayor Haddock stated this is a reuse permit from Payson. Once the new sewer plant is built 133 Payson wants to reuse the Elk Ridge sewer wastewater in their power plant and as secondary 134 water. This is only a draft. The attorneys for Woodland Hills, Payson and Elk Ridge are still 135 working on this. Councilmember Abbott asked what Payson is going to pay Elk Ridge for the 136 reuse. One of Councilmember Abbott's frustrations is part of the reason Elk Ridge power costs 137 are high is because Payson said they no longer had the water necessary to run their power plant 138 even though they had the water to run the power plant. They are taking the water and sending it 139 out into the fields to the farmers from the sewer plant instead and taking the farmers' water and 140

using it for their growth. Payson failed to plan properly for their infrastructure. There is a value

154		lines from Elk Ridge are newer and based on the condition of those lines, almost all the water is								
155		making it to the sewer plant so it should be pretty hard data; other words in the winter months if								
156		Elk Ridge sends 100,000 gallons Payson is getting at least 950,000 to 980,000 gallons. Elk Ridge								
157		should have the city engineer extrapolate what residents use per month. <u>Councilmember</u>								
158		<u>Thompson</u> stated he reached out to Ty Ellis to figure out the sewer usage previously and he said								
159		he would put a presentation together, council just needs to say when and he said he would do it.								
160		<u>Councilmember Thomas</u> suggested having a joint meeting with Payson. Discussion ensued on								
161		other items they could discuss at a joint meeting, such as water pressure, water rates along with
