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4. ORDINANCE 6-1-5 SNOW REMOVAL

<u>Mayor Haddock</u> stated the city sent out a city-wide message about parking on the street during snow removal and the city got a lot of blow back because the trucks didn't go out and when does it snow removal begin and at what point does it mean you can't park on the road. <u>Councilmember Thomas</u> stated when does personal responsibility begin for driving in a snowstorm? Is there none? <u>Councilmember Peterson</u> stated he is in agreement with Councilmember Thomas. <u>Councilmember Abbott</u> doesn't think there has been a big enough event for snow removal but that doesn't mean there hasn't been a layer of ice that needs salt or cinders. <u>Charles Wixom</u> stated the city needs signs that state winter conditions may exist drive accordingly/at own risk. All Councilmembers agree that 1 snowflake qualifies as no parking on the road and see no reason to change the code.

5. <u>I-9 SPORTS</u>

<u>Councilmember Willis</u> stated we used I9 Sports last year because the city could not find anyone to run the soccer program. It did not cost the city anything, but it was very expensive to enroll a child and they had to travel quite a bit. <u>Councilmember Willis</u> will contact Salem to see about working with them and offering the city fields for a better registration price.

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6. PARK CONCEPT, PARKING LOT AND PAVILION

<u>Mayor Haddock</u> stated gravel has been added to the side of the Cotton Tail Rd. for diagonal parking, the pickleball courts have been doubled, the pavilion has been slid further away from the courts, and there is a basketball court. <u>Councilmember Thompson</u> is still concerned about the noise from the pickle ball courts. Discussion ensued on the park hours. The plans are going to go out to bid.

7. <u>CITY OFFICE REMODEL</u>

<u>Mayor Haddock</u> went through the plans of the remodel. Discussion ensued on the front door area and foyer. <u>Councilmember Thomas</u> stated she believes that the city should not let the new city building die. Discussion ensued on how the new city offices would have been paid for. <u>Councilmember Thompson</u> said he is back and forth with building a new office but does not want to abandon the new building completely. <u>Councilmember Peterson</u> stated he thinks the city will eventually have to build a new building, probably in the next 5 years and right now larger facilities and meeting room is a need not a want.
