28	Maureen Bushman stated the planning commission is finishing up the general plan.

31	REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING AGENDA ITEMS:					
32	1. <u>RYAN BYBEE CONCEPT PRESENTATION</u>					
33	Ryan Bybee Developer of Ambleview Subd. stated he met with the Mayor and discussed the					
34	commercial property in Ambleview Subd. He would like to put in self-storage on a portion of the					
35	commercial that is one story, some climate control units. There would be a wall of some kind to					
36	separate the commercial area from the residential. This would have a nice facade, clean and quiet.					
37	Ryan stated it is in his best interest to have a nice-looking facility because he is selling homes					
38	right behind it. Councilmember Peterson updated Ryan with the work the county is doing on Elk					
39	Ridge Dr. and 11200. The county will be putting in the water and sewer lines for the city					
40	specifically for this commercial area which will need to be reimbursed by the developer through					
41	an agreement. The county will not let anyone cut into the new road for 5 years. It may be a good					

42 time to get this started on the project. The consensus of the council was positive.

43 2. <u>SPEED LIMIT CANYONVIEW DRIVE EXTENSION</u>

- 44 There are no driveways on the new road. The City Council set the speed limit as 30 mph. Deputy 45 Monson agreed that 30 mph would be acceptable since there are no driveways or front yards.
- 46 Recommends flashing speed limit signs.

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COUNCILMEMBER PETERSON MOTIONED TO SET THE SPEED LIMIT ON THE NEW CANYONVIEW DR BETWEEN THE UPPER AND LOWER CURVES AS 30 MPH AND 25 OUTSIDE OF THAT COUNCILMEMBER PAXTON SECONDED

3. <u>ROUNDABOUT TRAFFIC SIGN DISCUSSION</u>

<u>Councilmember Peterson</u> stated vehicles are not slowing down for pedestrians and the roundabout
 and recommends pedestrian signs ahead of the roundabout. Discussion ensued on various options
 such as flags, flashing signs with a button, refreshing the crosswalk paint on the road, flashing
 LEDS embedded in the road. Councilmember Peterson suggested Jerry Clark, Public Works
 Director get the cost estimated for four signs and discuss this again at the next meeting.

59 4. <u>SKY HAWK PARK IMPROVEMENTS DISCUSSION</u>

- Mayor Haddock passed the bids around to the council. Originally the city had \$500,000 slated for 60 the pavilion and parking lot. Since then, the council added pickleball courts, and a basketball 61 court. The sports court with the special surface is \$377,340. Maintenance on the special surface 62 has to be done every other year and recommends concrete instead. With the scaled down version 63 with concrete and without a bathroom (at this time), lighting and landscaping, the estimate is 64 \$754,000. Councilmember Paxton suggested holding off for a year and trying to get grants and 65 doing the whole thing. Melanie is meeting with a grant writer and will speak with her about this. 66 Councilmember Thompson recommends putting in gravel for the parking lot this year. Mayor 67 Haddock will ask Jerry Clark for an estimate on the gravel parking lot. Discussion ensued on 68 restrooms and vandalism and availability. Maureen Bushman stated Ron Hill of the Planning 69 Commission has spoken with other cities concerning restrooms and will be presenting his 70 findings at the May Planning Commission meeting. Discussion tabled. 71

- SESD Councilmember Thompson stated he is on the committee to help find more generating
 resources which is very hard to find in this area. He will bring any discussions of rate hikes to the
 council. He will have the SESD presentation scheduled. SESD sponsors a youth leadership camp
 every summer for high school juniors called EUREKA. SESD pays for all of it, and it's held at
 Snow College. They take 10 kids and there are presentations by business leaders on developing
 entrepreneurial ideas, and the application period is open now.
