Shuler Lane: Meeting with Residents of Shuler Lane

Mayor Haddock stated the last time Council discussed widening Shuler Lane, putting a good base under it and making it more usable was Sep. 24, 2019. There is potential for development someday and the road would need to handle more traffic. There is some easement on the right side which could be used to widen it but there is mature landscaping and other things that might not make some happy. The council would like to hear the residents' vision and see what they would like to happen. There was a comment on the grade and engineering. Councilmember Peterson stated the hope is that from this meeting, council can come up with a plan to take to an engineer and have them design it and get it in the budget for next year. The city fiscal year starts in July. The city standard starts at 46 feet at the narrowest which is not going to work through there. Right off Goosenest the width is 22 feet wide, and the narrowest is like 16 feet. Resident Mark Brown stated the road measures 24 feet at Goosenest and narrows to 21 feet at the crest of the hill. Councilmember Willis stated the official recording of the road has 29 ft to 32.28 ft dedicated to the city. Councilmember Peterson spoke to Fire Chief Waite on what is the minimum needed for access, which is 22 feet, which prohibits any on-street parking. There would need to be some stipulations on that. No matter what the city does with the road the grade will exceed the standard. The 2 exceptions that will be needed are the width of the road and the grade. Exceptions can be made for a limited length of road and thinks the exceptions will be made as this is an existing road, one of the oldest in the city. Councilmember Peterson would like to see some of the steepness removed for snow removal purposes. As a snowplow driver he knows this is a problem. Fire Chief Waite stated as long as access to the corral remains open, he doesn't need a turn around. The only safety concern is coming off of Shuler Lane onto Goosenest. Discussion ensued on runoff which mostly goes down the south side of Goosenest and as long as the residents are ok with what the city is doing, the Fire Chief is fine with the road width as long as it is improved. Discussion ensued on widening the road and the residents' thoughts which were open to moving sprinklers and removing some trees but didn't want it to encroach too far into their property. No one typically parks on the street so that would be ok. Councilmember Peterson stated the conceptual engineering drawing could be done this year's budget with a budget amendment. Engineering would determine curbing or a ribbon. Mayor Haddock stated all the homes are on Goosenest Water and septic so there is no other infrastructure to deal with. Councilmember Peterson stated he thought the city now had what was needed to go to the engineer.
