35	Marcus Williams- The Hales Theater has moved to Pleasant Grove			
36	Steve Anderson - Fusion Networks is an internet service provider here in Elk Ridge and has been			
37	providing high speed broadband here for 4-5 years now. Steve gave an update on the Elk Ridge			
38	Fiber Project. Fusion has purchased existing fiber optics infrastructure from SESD and has been			
39	able to expand that infrastructure. Fusion has recently completed installing fiber on the north end			
40	of town near Grizzly Way and Bear Hollow for 131 homes. They currently are working on			
41	Hillside Dr serving the south end of town. The goal in the next 12 months is to have fiber available			
42	to the entire city from Loafer Canyon to Coley's Cove and everyone in between. Right now,			
43	Fusion is trying to bring grant money to Elk Ridge to help expedite that construction. Fusion now			
44	has to find a place to put all the gear that makes the network run. Fusion is grateful for the support			
45	they have received from the city and looks forward to continuing servicing and working with the			
46	city.

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## 2. <u>IMPACT FEES</u>

Mayor Haddock stated Curtis Roberts, City Financial Director, filed the Impact Fee Report with 52 the state and the State Auditor didn't like it. The city has impact fees that do not have supporting 53 projects and need to be returned to the developer. These are fees that go back to 2011. A project 54 has to be in the Capital Facilities plan and be connected to growth. The impact fees for the sewer 55 were stopped a few months ago for the city portion; Payson's portion is still being collected. A 56 57 motion needs to be made to stop the road impact fees at this point. Councilmember Thompson stated the city has a growth-related project, the city needs a sewer plant and needs clarification on 58 the issue. Councilmember Peterson stated it had to be an identified project. Royce Swensen stated 59 the identified projects have been completed. The only identified project is the Dugway (hillside 60 going down east Park Drive to Loafer Canyon). Every time it was brought up, with the match, it 61 was never passed by the council. Councilmember Thompson said the council needs to get the 62 sewer plant into the Capital Facilities now. Mayor Haddock stated the amount to return is 63 significant, about 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> million dollars between the sewer and the roads. Discussion ensued on the 64 Dugway. It would be a 50/50 match and does the city want to use money from the general fund to 65 project. The report has to be filed 60 days from March 5th, which is May 5th. Royce Swensen 66 stated the Capital Facilities report was just done and no sewer or road projects were identified that 67 meet the criteria for impact fees for growth. The city cannot use impact fees for repairs. 68 Councilmember Peterson stated everyone has looked at this and the lesson learned is the city needs 69 to get the projects needed on the Capital Facilities plan. The list they are looking at was made 70 before the current council. Royce Swensen stated he has to make a report showing all the impact 71 fees collected for each year. Royce Swensen stated that in order to keep the money you have to 72 73 have allocated funds to a project. Councilmember Willis stated we have a project, the Dugway, the city doesn't have to return the funds. Royce Swensen stated but the city has not committed any 74 funds. The city would have to come up with 50% which would come out of the general fund, 75 which would be at last estimated \$700,000 to \$800,000. Councilmember Willis said then the city 76 hurry's and commits it and pays for half now instead of all of it later and does that hillside need 77 stabilized and will they need that 50 years from now. The project needs to be done at some point. 78 Councilmember Peterson stated the main exit from the city now is Canyon View. The discussion 79 now is does the project still need to be done now that Canyon View is the main corridor and would 80 rather spend the money elsewhere. The Dugway is narrow, and the bulk of the traffic goes down 81 Canyon View. The rules are you have a Capital Facilities Project that sets the ration. Mayor 82 Haddock stated the road could be abandoned and used for a trail. Councilmember Thompson read 83 the state code which said the funds can be held longer if the city can show a compelling reason and 84 give a date on which they will be expended. It would be amazing to keep the funds for a real 85 project that the city needs but if the city doesn't have one then we don't have one. Councilmember 86 Willis asked for clarification that it would have had to be in the capital facilities plan. Continued 87 below 88

## COUNCILMEMBER PETERSON MOTIONED TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FOR MARCH 11, 2025, COUNCILMEMBER WIXOM SECONDED.

- 101 VOTE AYE (5) NAY (0) Approved
  - <u>Royce Swensen</u> asked the Mayor if the council would go back to the impact fee discussion; a motion is needed to suspend road impact fees.

Councilmember Paxton asked why the road on Canyon View above the extension needs to be 106 widened. Councilmember Peterson stated it wasn't on the Capital Facilities Plan when it was 107 collected. It had to have been on the Capital Facilities Plan and the percentage as to have been 108 allocated to it. Councilmember Willis stated the council didn't get anything on this and hasn't had 109 time to research anything. Councilmember Peterson stated this has been why the urgency to update 110 the Capital Facilities. Councilmember Thompson stated the funds cannot be used for repairs; it 111 has to be growth related. Royce Swensen stated Canyon view was studied from Canyon View to 112 11200 and it did not become a project. Councilmember Paxton stated the council needs to exhaust 113 in how to use the money. Royce Swensen stated right now all he has to do is the report which 114 includes where every fee came from. The city loses funding if the report is not done by May 5th. 115 The money doesn't have to be returned just yet. In the current plan the only project is the dugway. 116 When a project is placed in the Capital Facilities plan an impact fee study takes place, then the fees 117 are collected for that project. Councilmember Thompson stated the city has 6 years to use the 118 funds and the funds have to be allocated. Councilmember Willis wants clarification from the 119 attorney. Councilmember Peterson stated Royce has been harping on this for half a decade to 120 update the Capital Facilities Plan. Royce Swensen stated the city received a letter stating the city 121 has 60 days to resolve this and he has to get the report in. The only attachment that could have 122 been given to you was the letter. Councilmember Peterson stated the letter says the city unjustly 123 over collected and we need to resolve it. The city did some projects but right now the only option 124 the city has is to do the dugway road and the city has to 50/50 it. Curtis Robert's the city's 125 Financial Director and the State have confirmed all of this. Royce Swensen stated it is on the 126 agenda in order to tell you of the report received by the state. Councilmember Paxton said then 127 why don't we do the dugway. We can add a trail to that and get a MAG grant. Councilmember 128 Willis stated it was mentioned earlier about turning that whole piece of road into a trail. 129 Councilmember Peterson stated that the road is used a fraction of what it was. Go for the grant but 130 he isn't willing to spend the city's money on that project just to use the fees when \$700,000 could 131 be spent elsewhere. The money has to be returned to whoever paid it. Councilmember Wixom 132 stated he's not sure unjustly is the right word, the city collected the money in anticipation of what 133 costs but when the actual costs came down to it the city did not spend that money and therefore, 134 they are due back. Councilmember Thompson stated the city probably has to give it back. 135

136	Councilmember Thompson stated it's fun to ask an attorney, but the Utah State Impact Fee Act			
137	(11-36a-302) reads: "Impact fee facility plan must be completed before imposing the impact fee."			
138	If the city does not have a road project technically the city cannot collect it. "The impact facility			
139	plan must include among other things identification of existing level of service An impact fee			
140	facilities plan shall: (i) identify the existing level of service; (ii) subject to Subsection (1)(c),			
141	establish a proposed level of service; (iii) identify any excess capacity to accommodate future			
142	growth at the proposed level of service; (iv) identify demands placed upon existing public facilities			
143	by new development activity at the proposed level of service; and (v) identify the means by which			
144	the political subdivision or private entity will meet those growth demands.			
145	For refunding the money 11-36a-603 Refunds - The city is required to give notice and post for a			
146	period of time, if it's not claimed, after 12 months of notice the city can use the money for any			
147	current capital facilities. There are requirements as to where it must be posted. If the government			
148	collected money and it was not used it should be given back. Mayor Haddock stated there is some			
149	time to research it and discuss it but right now the report needs to be done, and road impact fees			
150	need to stop being collected until the city has a project.
