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PLANNING COMMISSION UPDATE

Maureen Bushman - There is no update.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Becky Simmons – She is interested in the Dark Sky Code discussion and the recent thefts and would like to be educated on the police presence in Elk Ridge. She supports safety but also supports the Dark Sky Code.

Deputy Monsen was present and stated she works 86 hours per pay period. 90% of her time is spent in the city unless she has training. She is part of the drone team that has been surveilling the city in regard to catching those who have been stealing from unlocked cars. If she is not in the city, Salem and other County Deputies are called in when needed. As far as Dark Sky: she worked for Payson City, and they have street lights everywhere and it did not deter crime. The video footage from the victims in Elk Ridge shows the thieves wearing masks and are completely covered up. They do not care if there are lights on or if there are cameras. They are crimes of opportunity, try the door – locked- move to the next. The thing that will deter them is not allowing yourself to be a victim; lock the car, bring valuables inside. Elk Ridge is a safe town, the crime rate is *extremely* low compared to the surrounding cities. Most of these crimes are happening closer to 11200 where the homes are closer together. There was an incident further up the hill but that was not the norm.
