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increased every year. With the city's growth the fire and EMS department calls are increasing and 48 49 26% of calls are from the care center. Councilmember Willis asked if the calls from the 55 plus community were tracked. The Fire Chief will add the community to his tracking. The total number 50 of personnel is down. The fire department is having a hard time getting people to join. 51 Councilmember Wixom asked if there was a database or something where certified EMTS or 52 firefighters can be found? The Fire Chief stated there is not. He has asked individuals who are 53 certified for EMS or who are employed elsewhere, and the response is "I do this every day I don't 54 want to do it when I get home" and he gets that. Even paying for the training isn't working. 55 Councilmember Paxton asked if the Fire Chief has talked with other communities and if they are 56 struggling as well. Fire Chief stated all communities are struggling, some are eleven worse off 57 than Elk Ridge; Salem and Payson are struggling, even the cities that are full time. Families are 58 59 busy with children's activities, work and don't feel like they can afford to or have the time to volunteer. Fire Chief stated if calls keep increasing and the city loses 2 more EMT's the 60 department won't be able to respond to anything. Currently 3-4 of our EMT's out of 9 are covering 61 all of the shifts up to about 85%. EMT's have cut back to 1 EMT on call which is 60 shifts, they 62 are doing flexible schedules as much as they can. Councilmember Paxton asked what the city is 63 going to do if the Fire Chief ever retired? The Fire Chief has tried to groom and train individuals 64 65 to take over, he isn't going to be here forever. Everyone is busy; he retired and is wondering how he had time for his day job. There was legislation passed recently that if you volunteer to make 66 67 medical calls and respond to 20% of the city's call you can get insurance through a grant, which 68 they are working on now and have had several requests for enrollment for the insurance. The fire chief stated he has not done anything with the pay scale and asked if council is ok with him 69 adjusting for a cost of 3% living increase or what would the council like him to do? 70 Councilmember Willis stated that the increase needs to be bigger and look at the long-term 71 insurance due exposure to harmful elements. Councilmember Wixom stated the council needs to 72 determine if the cost-of-living increases should be automatic or if increases need to be requested. 73 The Fire Chief stated his budget is the same as last year and does not have a cost-of-living increase 74 and they have been staying within their budget but would like to add the cost-of-living increase. 75 76 Councilmember Peterson stated this is the fire chief's budget and put in what is needed. Councilmember Willis would like to see at least a 5% increase. The fire chief stated what is the 77 dollar amount that makes people happy? The fire department increased the amount several years 78 ago and it did nothing. Councilmember Wixom asked what other cities that are struggling are 79 doing to try and correct the problem? Fire Chief stated they are having the same problem as Elk 80 Ridge: no one new is moving in to draw from, everyone is busy. It is not just Utah either. 81 Councilmember Peterson stated it's everywhere in the trades and agrees there should be an 82 increase, he doesn't know what that is but yes. The Fire Chief will get a revised budget to council 83 for the public hearing on the tentative budget. 84

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The Fire Chief explained that fire permits have been issued since he has lived here, which is a very 86 87 long time. Over the last 5 years or so before the Bald Mountain Fire, the Fire Department has been working with the State with CWPP which is a way for cities to do in-kind things to meet a 88 requirement, an insurance premium, to help the city fight a fire. In 2018 the city was able to get all 89 that money back, even though it was a federal fire, because the city had met the state agreement. 90 91 Because pf the burn permits and all of the things that were done last year, our matching funds to

the state are \$5,400. By process, in excess of \$11,000 back to the state in in-kind labor, 85% of 92 that was burn permits. Fire Chief takes the burn permits based upon the hours the individuals want 93 94 to burn, I credit it 8 hours, do a time on that and multiply that out and then the burn and all the clearing time and burning time, it basically doubled the insurance premium to the state because of 95 all the things the city is doing within the community. The Fire Department started Chipper Days 96 this year. The state chipping crews on the wildland crews have been chipping bush and limbs 97 residents have cleared from their lot. This is all paid for by a grant to the state. Residents have to 98 sign up and follow the requirements. The state wants to see in kind hours- how long they were 99 100 clearing which really counts towards the city's monetary requirement. Councilmember Paxton 101 asked how the Fire Chief gets an account of all of that. The Fire Chief stated its all online with links on the city website for residents to sign up. I run reports off of those permits. 102 Councilmember Peterson stated burn permits chipping go into your reports and are beneficial. 103 Burn permits are good for 1 day but they can burn as many days as they want, they will get a 104 permit for each day. Fire Chief went through the burn permit process. The Fire Department gets 105 calls all the time of open burn fires, in fact they answered the call on the resident who was referred 106 to earlier had all the safety precautions in place and was better prepared than most. 107 Councilmember Peterson asked if he thought open burns were appropriate in all parts of the city. 108 There are some areas where lots are smaller, and homes are close. The Fire Chief stated based on 109 the conversations and discussions, since that call, he plans on speaking with that resident to see if 110 there is anything that can be done to mitigate risks. Councilmember Peterson is all about safety 111 and property rights but does not think open burns should be allowed in some areas of town. 112 Councilmember Wixom stated that maybe individuals can be denied permits for repeated burn 113 issues. Fire Chief Waite stated if there are people who feel they have the room and can burn safely 114 then he does not care if the get a permit. The bigger the pile the bigger the fire, bigger piles should 115 be broken down into smaller piles and burn over several days. The city gets so much benefit on the 116 back end. By popular demand he does not have a list. There are people who have had problems in 117 the past who he has asked to be told they have a permit so they can help mitigate instead of 118 banning it completely. Councilmember Willis wants to red list those who are problems. 119 Councilmember Peterson stated it is a matter of risk versus reward. Mayor Haddock asked if there 120 could be size restrictions on the diameter of brush on the permit. Fire Chief stated they got a call 121 on a totally legitimate burn that someone saw from the highway, he gets calls on smokers. If the 122 council feels they need to legislate this then that's fine. The next open burn is in the fall and set by 123 the County Fire Marshall. The council will discuss this further at a future meeting. 124

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2. <u>E BIKES SCOOTERS CITY CODE</u>

Mayor Haddock turned the time over to Deputy Hanson regarding ordinance on E Bikes etc. 127 Deputy Monson stated Salem City has some really good rules regarding E Bikes which the city 128 129 should look at, She also thinks the gold cart ordinance needs to be tightened up, so they follow the 130 same rules as motorcycles. Motorcycles, golf carts E bikes have to follow the same road rules as a car. If she stops someone once, she gives them an official warning, the second time they get a 131 132 ticket. E bikes have to follow the rules and are not permitted to go over 20 on the street. Bicycles can roll stop signs but even they have to follow the speed limit. Even trails have speed limits. It's 133 difficult to know the different classifications and thinks the rules need to be simplified and pertain 134 135 to all bikes. Golf carts are not a huge issue, but the code is worded poorly. The biggest problem is
