19	1. <u>CE 3 DISCUSSION</u>
20	Maureen Bushman stated that the current draft has input from the city Planner and administration and the commission will start at page
21	Larry Lee stated that the snow removal and trails need attention as well as lot size. The question is what kind of lots does the city want,
22	large lots or lines of small lots. What does the city want in this area. Maureen Bushman asked if there were any changes that need to be
23	made on Legislative intent. Melanie Paxton asked about the statements/questions from the City Planner and the removal of the trails in
24	legislative intent. Maureen Bushman stated that the last meeting it was determined that moved to a different section. Ron Gaily state
25	additions to legislative intent section that are needed are; 1. protection from fire, 2. public access to trails. These are stated further in the
26	code but are foundational issues for that area. Planning Commission members agreed to the general items and that the details on fire
27	protection are further in the code. Discussion ensued on whether the sewer falls under water shed or under drainage. Maureen Bushman
28	stated the city planner stated there is unstable solid everywhere but can be mitigated by engineering it is not considered unstable soil.
29	Professional insight on the slopes is required. Steeper slopes can have trails and wildlife corridors but not part of the building envelope.
30	Discussion ensued on fault lines and the definition for fault lines was added. <u>Larry Lee</u> stated wildlife corridors need to be connected.
31	Maureen Bushman stated it is ambiguous as to what a wildlife corridor is and the planning commission doesn't have the authority to
32	designate what the corridor is. A study is going to be done by the Division of Wildlife that will be mapping these corridors across the
33	whole area, but it will take a couple years. Maureen Bushman stated the city planner said that putting up fencing because of deer is too
34	restrictive as deer will jump over a 6-foot fence if they can see through it; restricting fencing didn't make sense. Ron Gaily asked for
35	clarification that the fencing section was removed which was confirmed. Discussion ensued on lower fencing. Larry Lee stated that once
36	the sensitivity map with the drainage ravines etc. is completed then it will better show where the wildlife corridors are located.
37	Discussion on fencing and terracing on lots to prevent unbuildable areas in steep slopes part of the buildable area. Maureen Bushman
38	stated that 3 options for open space have been left in and will defer to city council to make the decision on open space. Larry Lee stated
39	that if there are no sidewalks then all the trails needed to be on road trails that are usable instead of natural trails that are not usable in the
40	winter. Maureen Bushman stated a trails map is being worked on by the trail committee. Discussion ensued on parking places at
41	trailheads and specifying what and where parking should be in the code. Revegetation plan to be general at preliminary. Maureen
42	Bushman stated the city planner stated 150 is generous at 150 feet and 170 is excessive. Mayor Haddock will confirm with public works
43	150 will be effective with snowplows and snow storage. Discussion ensued on lots size and with the 4 acre lots and the clustering with 1
44	acre lots and bonus density which is in the general plan. Just having 4 acre lots is problematic for landowners that have small parcels and
45	without clustering you cannot require trails etc. Maureen Bushman stated the city planner suggested 150-foot frontage and no additional
46	exception. Maureen Bushman stated the planning commission has taken this code as far as they can without the city council's input and
47	recommends moving the CE3 code onto council
48	MAUREEN BUSHMAN MOTIONED TO SEND THIS TO CITY COUNCIL FOR THEIR INPUT RON HILL SECONDED
